pression for the death of Canon O'Gorman to the 31st March, 1942, in connection with the scheme for the distribution of milk to necessitous children in the County Borough of Limerick.

Tenders can be accepted only from persons who are registered under the Milk and Dairies Act, 1935, and, except in the case of milk supplied under a special designation, are in a position to supply the milk from their own cows. Preference will be given to highest grade milk and for other milk supplied under a special designation.

Contractors must deliver the milk in such quantities as may be required at specified depots throughout the City not later than 10 a.m. each morning. Tenders can be submitted for milk (a) in bulk, and/or (b) in pint and half-pint sealed bottles.

Tenders, enclosed in sealed envelopes, marked on the outside "Tender for Milk" shall be delivered not later than Tuesday, 11th March, 1941, in the manner prescribed by the regulations for the reception and examination of tenders made by the Council. Copies of the regulations can be obtained at my office.

The lowest or any tender not necessarily accepted.

**COUNTY BOROUGH OF LIMERICK, NATIONAL FREE MILK SUPPLY GRANT.**

**TO REGISTERED MILK VENDORS IN THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF LIMERICK.**

The Corporation of Limerick invite tenders from Milk Vendors in the County Borough of Limerick who are registered under the Milk and Dairies Act, 1935, for the distribution of milk to be provided under the above scheme to necessitous children for the period from the 1st April, 1941, to the 31st March, 1942, and in accordance with the terms defined in the form of tender, a copy of which can be had on application to the undersigned.

The Corporation propose to establish depots in the different Wards in the City from which the milk will be distributed to holders of milk tickets issued by them, and milk vendors should tender for the distribution of the milk in their area. Milk may be delivered by suppliers in sealed bottles or in bulk.

The proprietor of the milk shop shall, before the definite selection of his premises for the distribution of milk under the scheme, satisfy the Medical Superintendent Officer of Health and the Chief Veterinary Officer as to the suitability of his premises for such purpose, and thereafter shall carry out the instructions of such officers or other authorised officers of the Sanitary Authority as regards improvements in premises or methods of distribution.

Tenders, enclosed in sealed envelopes, marked on the outside "Tenders for Distribution of Milk," shall be delivered not later than Tuesday, 11th March, 1941, in the manner prescribed by the regulations for the reception and examination of tenders made by the Council. Copies of the regulations can be obtained at my office.
