### FOYNES RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were passed at a committee meeting of Foynes Branch of the Unemployed Workers' Association:—

"The Unemployed Workers' Association demands that the Board of Health distribute a minimum of one pint of free milk per day for each child under five years in unemployed families, and the number of contractors, which is at present totally inadequate, shall be substantially increased to meet the need for new milk of the children of the very poor."

"The Unemployed Workers' Association protests against the present system of delayed payments to men employed on relief works, as a result of which they frequently are without any income for as much as five weeks and are consequently unable to obtain credit from shopkeepers."
