### New Houses.

The five new houses built by working men at Athea are almost ready for occupation and are very neat, compact buildings and the architect who designed them is to be complimented for the excellence he has shown in planning them. Great credit, too, to the contractor who was responsible for their erection, Mr. O'Halloran. He has certainly carried out his work in a thoroughly satisfactory manner that deserves the highest praise. These dwellings are very commodious and each room upstairs as well as the ground floor is furnished with furniture. The kitchen or living room is furnished with an electric range and each house contains a number of sunk cupboard presses. Every inch of space has been utilised, while the lighting and ventilation leaves nothing to be desired.

### Garden Plots.

In addition to a concrete path each house possesses a small garden plot at the rear, and it is mentioned that all are connected with the water main.
