Early in her reign private instructions were sent to Government officials in Dublin encouraging them to have the Protestant Liturgy secretly practised in their homes. At the Parliament of 1560—around which controversy still rages—the Protestant party, though in a minority, rushed legislation through declaring Elizabeth Supreme Governor of the Church, the Protestant and impos.ng Liturgy as wen as abolishing Papal authority.
