Canon Hogan, P.P., V.F., who is Chairman of the Fairs and Markets Tolls Committee, that a licence would be granted for the holding of the fair on the 30th inst. No pig market was arranged because of the insufficient time available for publication, and because most of the pigs of the district had already been purchased and forwarded to the different factories during the past ten days.
