BIG DRAINAGE PROJECT

The Corporation of Waterworks has adopted a report of the Drainage Manager (Mr. D. A. Hegarty) recommending the drainage of Kilbarry marshes, which comprise 300 acres and extend into the city borough. The marshes are regarded as a nuisance to public health and a hindrance to the growth of the city. The drainage scheme is estimated to cost approximately £30,000.
