Full entry of beef; small handy weights, nicely fed, ready buyers, met exchange touched full current rates; young beef cows steadily older cows met a slower trade in this section not so quick as last week. Numbers of useful forward which met firm trade, especially bullocks. Young storey bullocks. Exchange for heifers, which were freely offered, and a much better demand for bullocks. Young store cattle disappointing, rough and many class not wanted. Fat sheep and bullocks best, £20 to £22; second run £14 to £19. Sheep, best, £18 to £22 10s.; second run £13 5s. to £17 10s. Two and a half year old heifers and bullocks, £13 17s. 6d.; second run, £8 5s. to £11. One and a half year old ewes and heifers £8 15s. to £11; second run £7 15s. to £7 7s. 6d. Average attendance of 100; better class in general; more and enquiry for choice including heavy sheep. Nice pens, in which class there were many pens, attracted attention had ready buyers and kept on an even level; better and demand for good sheep. Current rates ruled; top prices offered in owners' favour. Well-fed with quality wanted and cashed. Short supply of fat sheep which were readily bid for; sheep and lambs a quiet trade. Ewes fair selling trade, old difficult to cash. Business in section satisfactory with a good and early clearance effected. Middle-weight, 67/6 to 81/-; best, 69/- to 75/6; second run 68/- to 67/6.
