

WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, September 3rd—Small entry of cattle, which comprised mostly beef heifers and cows; practically no stores on offer. Beef met a firm selling trade at prices around recent quotations. Fat cows were in demand, and mostly all cashed. Store trade continues quiet. Fat heifers, best, £20 to £20 10s.; fat cows, best, £16 5s. to £18 15s.; ordinary, £12 10s. to £15 10s.; yearling bullocks, £6.

Sheep—Seasonable supply of sheep and lambs, the greater bulk being store lambs. Trade all round quieter than last week, and recent quotations hard to maintain. Trade for lambs disappointing. Hoggets, 56s. to 66s.; second run, 45s. to 53s.; ewes, 44s. 6d. to 52s. 6d.; lambs, best, 42s. 6d. to 45s.; stores, 26s. to 35s.—Wm. B. Fitt & Co. Auctioneers.
