PROMINENT CHURCHMAN PASSES

A prominent Churchman abroad, Right Rev. Monsignor R. S. Benson, P.P., V.G., Geelong, news of whose death has been received from Melbourne, was born in Adare, Co. Limerick, 77 years ago. He was educated at Rockwell and All Hallows, Dublin, and was ordained in 1887. After some years in Australia he was appointed Dean and Pastor of Geelong in 1925. The Apostolic Delegate presided at ceremonies for his sacerdotal golden jubilee in 1937.
