Nice entry of beef, including some handy weight heifers and bullocks, which met fair selling trade at current rates. Fresh heiferish cows readily placed; heavy cows also in demand and well. All finished lots met ready exchange. Short supply of store; young stores of nice quality and condition met fair exchange, and changed hands, and where vendors showed "give and take" sales were effected. The general tone of the market was brighter than last week. Good clearance effected.

Sheep. Full seasonable entry, though, however, might have been better average show. Usual attendance of buyers, and trade in pens was firm and nicely finished lots with made full current rates, were quickly placed; prime active enquiry and also good hoggets. Fresh ewes in condition for lambing trade. All round up to par with last market. Terms had to be paid, many of fat lambs demand some lambs a quiet trade; hoggets dull and tedious. General run of business steady and active. Market finished with a good sell up.
