It is hard to get people to realise the marvellous properties of slaunlas. In cases of bad cuts, bleeding from the nose, etc., an application of chopped up slaunlas will immediately stop bleeding; and continued application will heal the worst wound in a few days.

CURE FOR BOILS.

Many people are suffering from boils this year. Here is a cure I got to-night. Put a few fresh branches of pine or fir on the fire and when the sap begins to boil through the ends of the branches apply it on a piece of cloth, quite hot, on the boil. There is reason with the cure, as the sap of pine contains resin and turpentine which have definite curative properties.

Personally, I have unbounded faith in the old, old "soap and sugar" plaster for all forms of septic wounds. The sugar should be ground into the finest powder before adding the soap. I once asked a famous physician what he thought about it and I shall always remember his reply. "I always use it myself," he said, "but naturally I couldn't recommend it to a patient who paid me a guinea fee." I have been told that a little powdered resin added to the soap and sugar will make it still more effective.

OBITUARY

MR. M. D. MURPHY, BALLAUGH - ABBEYFEALE.

The death of Mr. Michael D. Murphy, of Ballaugh, Abbeyfeale, following an operation in a Limerick hospital, is widely regretted in West Limerick. Deceased was in his 69th year and was for many years poor rate collector for the Western section of the county. His official service was efficient and considerate, commanding the confidence and esteem of all concerned in its transaction. He was a member of a family who sacrificed the occupation of a valuable farm in the early eighties of the Land League for twenty years, succeeding in the Ballaugh O'Grady clearances. Nor did he and the members of his family escape the rigorous attention of the enemy in the Anglo-Irish fight, because of the hospitality given to those in the struggle for freedom. Deceased was father of the Rev. Michael Murphy, of the Mill Hill Fathers, and Mr. Edmond Murphy, M.P.S.I., Kilkee. A very large funeral procession accompanied the remains from Limerick to Abbeyfeale Parish Church, and on the 11th inst. following Requiem Mass, the interment took place in St. Mary's Cemetery in presence of an extraordinarily large attendance of the general public and relatives.


