WEEKLY DAIRY MARKET.

Monday, October 21st—The number of cows and in-calf heifers offered forward for sale was much larger than last week, quality and prices were well to the fore, including some choice dairy cows; on the whole class was well above the average, being the best show of the season. An extra large attendance including buyers from a distance, Dublin and the Eastern Counties being represented. Active bidding for the high grade dairy cows and heifer, for which there was sharp competition, these cows reached the highest level in prices of this season. There was a steady and sustained demand for choice and promising dairy cows showing the milking points which judges require. Promising cows, with size, shapes and udders were looked for and sold at all round on the higher level for the extra choice lots the price was substantial. Trade was active, stability and confidence with keen competition for choice and promising lots. Mr. Walsh, Bilboa, Cappamore, secured the highest honours, at £31 for a dairy cow which attracted much attention. Market practically sold up. In-calf and calved cows, best, £20 to £23 10s.; second run, £15 to £18 5s.; dairy cows, £26 10s. to £31; promising cows, £25; ordinary, £14 to £18. B. Fitt and Co., Auctioneers.

Cows and in-calf heifers, entry, strong attendance of buyers, and in the continued absence of competition of buyers for Channel markets demand good and showed an all-round increase on previous rates. Buyers were always prepared to pay for good cows and heifers. Top price for heifers was obtained by Patrick Kennedy, Ganavane, Cross, County Tipperary, at £28 for an in-calf heifer, while the owner obtained £20 5s. for a good heifer. In the dairy cow market Mr. John Vaughan, Mount, Kilbane, Broadford, secured top price at £20 5s., the top up being Mr. Cusack at £20. A few dairy cows or heifers were unsold. Dairy cows, best run, £20 5s.; second run £16 10s.; others £12 to £14 15s. In-calf heifers, best £18 15s.; second run £13 10s. to £15. Stores—the entry in this department was not big, a good many failed to obtain their requirements. A complete clearance effected, every lot entered has been sold.
