MR. C. C. O'ROURKE, THE SQUARE, ABBEYFEALE.

Following Solemn Requiem Mass on Monday, a very popular trader, Mr. Cornelius C. O'Rourke, of the Square, Abbeyfeale, was laid to rest in St. Mary's Cemetery, beside the Parish Church, where for more than forty years, until his retirement some years ago, he filled the office of Parish Clerk efficiently and reverently. In all that tended to advance the commercial and social interests of the town he took a useful and active part. For a time he was Chairman of the Limerick G.A.A. County Board. In his younger days he took a leading part in maintaining a very competent Amateur Dramatic Society, inclining the minds of a younger generation more usefully than now, perhaps, towards culture and art, in leisure hours. Connected with numerous families in the district, the attendance of the public at the removal of the remains to the Parish Church and the interment was of very large proportions. His much-regretted death removes a very popular figure from the town and district, where he commanded in a special manner the respect and affection of the people. Many messages and Mass cards were received.
