#### MR. DAN O'BRIEN, COOLREEDY.

The passing away of the old veteran, Dan O'Brien, Coolreedy, Castleconnell, was nearly the last link with the old I.R.B. movement in that corner of our county. He enjoyed splendid health up to a few days before his demise, and in later years was always entertaining with accounts of experiences, especially previous to and during the Land War. In the days of the Land League, National League and U.I.L. his fine form with stalwart Pat Hassett of Ahane were always to be seen on the long cars, then leading their home Leaguers to the massed meetings of Parnell, Davitt, Dillon, O'Brien, etc. In appreciation of those services Dan was elected as Poor Law Guardian and District Councillor up to the date of the discontinuance of those offices. In later days in the elections for the Dail he presided for the Republican candidates at Montpelier, etc. A new generation has arisen and with the passing of time men like Dan O'Brien retired to rest after 60 years upholding the cause of "Ireland a Nation," but their memory shall live as it was men of his type through our cities and country who always upheld the National Faith which led up to 1916. The funeral cortege to the family burial place at, Castleconnell was thoroughly representative, sympathisers attending from Clare, Limerick and Tipperary.
