Graceful Incident Recalled.

The death of Mr Bryan O'Donnell recalls that, when Mayor of Limerick, 1893-98, he was instrumental in having two boys sent from Limerick for treatment to a Pasteur Institute, Paris.

The Institute, which had then been established only a few years—it was founded in 1888—was gaining public distinction through Pasteur's researches into rabies in dogs, and the possibility of providing immunity from hydrophobia amongst persons who had been bitten.

Both boys were successfully treated and returned home to Limerick.
