Man's Body Found in Canal

Evidence at Limerick Inquest

The body of Mr Jeremiah Daly, "St. Rita's," Canal Bank, Limerick, was discovered floating in the Grand Canal, near his home on Sunday morning. Deceased, who was well known for his great interest in the National movement, failed to reach home, and it is presumed that he stumbled in the darkness and fell into the water. The deceased, who was a native of Kerry, was a man of splendid physique, was a well-known and popular figure in the city, and the deepest sympathy is felt with his wife and family. He was a prominent member of the Augustinian Church Building Fund Committee, in which he performed much valuable service.

The funeral which left St. Patrick's Church this (Tuesday) morning for the family burial ground at Kilsareon; County Kerry, was very largely attended. When the remains were removed the previous night from Barrington's Hospital to the Church they were escorted by a guard of honour of the L.S.F.
