Parting of Mr P Vaughan

The death took place on Monday at his residence, Rosmore, Castletownconyers, of Mr Patrick Vaughan, a former chairman of the Limerick County Council. Deceased was for many years a prominent figure in the public life of the county and was deservedly very popular with all classes. In his earlier years he was a creamery manager and in that capacity and in general he took a very keen and practical interest in the dairy industry. A man of great energy and initiative, he had very progressive ideas, which he put into practice successfully in the management of his own farm. For a period he was a Land Commissioner, a position in which he discharged his duties with great efficiency and satisfaction. Two of his sons are priests in the diocese of Dublin—Rev P Vaughan, CC St Lawrence O'Toole's, and Rev D Vaughan, CC St Michael's and John's.
