County Clergyman's Death

Very Rev Wm Canon Parcell, Pr. vr. Murroe, county Limerick, who died in a Dublin nursing home, aged 85, was a native of Kacekarron, Emly, county Tipperary. He received his early education at Emly and later studied classics at Kilteely, Co. Limerick, under the late Mr Wm Lundon, afterwards M.P. for East Limerick. He continued his studies at Thurles and Mount Melleray, and later west to the Irish Col lege, Paris, where he was ordained 58 years ago. He was afterwards appointed ourate at Maiden Lane Church, Strand, London, where he ministered for more than ten years During that time he was well known to Iriah people living in London, and was associated with the founders of the Saint Patrick's Day benquet in London.

When he returned to Ireland he ministered at Bausha and Templemore for more than 20 years. He was then appointed P.P. of Kilcommon and later at Murros.
