
Death of Mr. E. C. Ryan

It is with feelings of the most sincere regret that we announce the death of Mr E. C. Ryan, compositor, Denmark street, Limerick, which occurred at his residence on Monday evening after a rather protracted illness. Deceased, who had retired for some years on superannuation, was a member of an old and highly respected Limerick family, and was an exceedingly popular figure amongst his colleagues and associates. He was an ardent trade unionist, and was an ex-President of the Limerick Typographical Society, which body he represented for many years on the Limerick Trades Council in a very able manner.
