## Railway Shunter's Death

## The Inquest

With a jury at Barrington's Mospital, Mr J S McNeice, Deputy Corener, held as inquest into the circumstances of the death of Patrick Maker, 5 St. John's Terrace,

Limerick, a railway employe, as the result of an accident at Boher, on Nov. 28th.

Evidence was given that deceased was engaged in coupling wagons to a train when he slipped in the frost and one of the

wagous crushed his left foot. He was removed to Barrington's Hospital, where an amputation was performed and died on

the 6th December.

Dr Joseph Typan, house surgeon, Barrington's Hospital, said that he performed a post-mortem examination on the body, and found sizes of the gangrane infection.

a post-mortem examination on the body, and found signs of gas gangrene infection. Death was due to toxasmia from gas gangrene, contracted as a result of injuries he received.

The jury brought in a verict is accordance with the medical evidence, and added that no blame attached to anyone.
