### WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, January 21st—Cattle—The muster of cattle showed a substantial increase on recent markets and constituted a record for this season of the year; a much better class, more fat and strong cattle, and many useful drafts of nice quality stores. The attendance was large and most representative of shipping and local interests, with some strangers. The market presented a very business-like and active appearance from the start, and a decidedly healthy tone ruled in all sections. Beef met a firm selling trade; fat heifers and bullocks, nice handy weights, in strong demand, and touched top current rates. Fresh young beef cows steadily placed at full values, good beef in demand. Useful feeders with quality easily negotiated and changed hands readily, the value barometer being steady. Promising young stores were freely bid for, particularly choice two-year-old bullocks and heifers; rates for best drafts a turn in favour of vendors. Nice yearlings met steady inquiry, firm rates. All round business worked out on firm lines; dearer turn in values for promising drafts. A decidedly healthy
