MRS. E. RYAN; Ex-N.T., SALLYBANK.

After a long and happy life, this venerable lady peacefully passed to meet the Redeemer Whom she served and loved. An honoured member of the teaching profession, she for 36 years moulded the minds and formed the characters of generations of the children of Sallybank. Love of God and country was the sound basis of that teaching. It forms the better part of our national inheritance, and is bequeathed, enriched by her splendid example, to the six members of her family who followed the teaching profession. During the whole long period of her professional career and after her retirement she retained the same tender affection for all those to whom she gave tuition, and she received from all of them a corresponding reverent love. Her conception of public duty was so strict and valiant that she set herself in the late autumn of her professional service to master the Irish language and successfully taught it after attaining the age of 60 years. Her death caused widespread sorrow amongst those who grew up at her knee and regarded her as a second mother. They testified their deep regret and fervent remembrance at her obsequies and funeral. To her family the hearts of all friends, neighbours and ex-pupils go out in tender sympathy in this their day of bereavement.
