keen request and met a good selling trade  
at full previous currencies. Steady enquiry  
for useful drafts of stores, particularly for-  
ward lots, which were cashed at full values.  
Shipping and local interests operating. A

For choice stores demand was buoyant, with  
a readiness on the part of buyers to invest;  
terms were firm at late rates. Nicely bred  
yearlings were readily bought up. Good all  
round selling trade throughout the day.
