MR. R. F. RYAN.

The funeral of Mr. Robert Frewen Ryan, proprietor, Glenworth Hotel, Limerick, which took place on Saturday last to Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery after Requiem High Mass in St. Michael's Church, was of immense proportions. The late Mr. Ryan, who was a member of a prominent Co. Tipperary family, was one of Limerick's leading citizens, and his demise, though not unexpected, caused profound regret and sorrow not only in Limerick but throughout Munster. He was a brother of the late Right Rev. Dean Ryan, P.P., V.G., Cashel, and in that connection it might be observed that many other near relatives adopted the religious life.

The late Mr. Ryan was identified with the commercial life of Limerick for over fifty years and was well and popularly known in all parts of the country. Of a very affable and genial disposition, he made hosts of friends and it is no exaggeration to say that he commanded the confidence esteem and respect of all with whom he came in contact. His cheery disposition was most infectious and, needless to say, his companionship was much sought after. He was a fine type of Irish gentleman, debonair, witty, kindly, gracious and, above all, charitable. His passing has severed a link with a generation that produced many sterling figures and all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance mourn his death. Deep and heartfelt sympathy is tendered to his widow and family in their great bereavement.

## WARBLE FLY (TREATMENT OF CATTLE) ORDERS, 1936 AND 1939.

The Minister for Agriculture desires to remind stock-owners that the treatment period under the above-mentioned Orders commences on the 1st March. Any cattle visibly infested with the larvae of the Warble Fly must be dressed between the 1st and 7th days of each of the months of March, April, May, June and July with a cattle wash approved by the Minister.

Cattle dealers and exporters, as well as farmers and other stock-owners are liable to prosecution by the Minister and to penalties under the Diseases of Animals Acts if they are found to be in possession or in charge, at any place in this country, of cattle which are visibly infested with warbles and have not been dressed as required by the Orders.
