**THE PADDOCKS, LIMERICK.
WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.**

Wednesday, February 25th:—Entries numerically less than last week; well up to average description. Buyers in full attendance, both export and local. Beef, a short entry, made full current rates and wanted; nicely fed cattle easily sold at advanced rates. Fat cows drew sharp attention and met brisk competition; full current rates easily maintained; practical clearance in this section of the market. Weather conditions favourable and cattle looked their best. The turnout of stores not up to description of last week; steady demand for well bred stores of the right stamp. Good enquiry for useful feeders; in this department business was active; the tone of the market was even and steady; values on the basis of last week's level. Choice calves sold well; best rates. A healthy tone with firm trend in prices, and a good clearance effected. Fat heifers, £19 10s. to £25; fat cows, £21 to £25 10s.; second run, £12 to £20 5s.; two and a half year old bullocks and heifers, £18 to £21 10s.; second run, £13 10s. to £17 15s.; two year old bullocks and heifers, £13 10s. to £17 5s.; yearlings, £8 12s. 6d. to £10 1s.; second run, £5 14s. to £8 1s.

Sheep—Heavier entry; on the whole class well up to last week. Good attendance of buyers. Firm tone and enquiry for choice pens, including heavy sheep, but last week's advanced rates were not maintained. All round, trade not as quick as last Wednesday; nor did biddings run as smoothly. Nice small hoggets in demand. Fresh ewes with quality found buyers; in some cases vendors stood out for top rates of last week, which buyers were not forced to part; concession necessary to effect exchange. Proceedings over the day finished up well, the bulk of the sheep being sold. Fat middle weight, 80/- to 90/-; second run, 65/- to 77/-; small, 44/- to 60/-; ewes, best, 73/- to 87/-; second run, 60/- to 68/-; hoggets, 57/- to 63/-.—Wm. B. Fitt and Co., Auctioneers.
