WEEKLY DAIRY MARKET.

Tuesday, March 24th—Dairy proprietors who attended this market had the opportunity of obtaining heifers of a very choice description, as well as useful commercial heifers and a general run of nicely bred dairy heifers. The entry totalled a much greater numerical strength than last week, with a larger proportion of dairy cows. A strong attendance, some from a distance; practically all buyers. Shipping interests also represented. Weather conditions most favourable, as the bright spring sunshine put on "finish" and feather. Biddings for high-class heifers, with size, substance and quality, was brisk, and there was a ready and steady demand for all useful classes and a free and easy exchange. All round proceedings manifested a firmness, with stability, on the higher basis of values; with a bright business activity. Buyers on the look out for top lots were not disappointed; useful and promising heifers attracted sharp competition. The promise of milk is the qualification required, and where this features with colour and quality the exchange is easily effected; average useful heifers also in demand. The honours of the day went to Mr. James O'Malley, Lackareagh, Killaloe, for an exceptionally high class heifer, which realised, after keen competition, £35 10s. Active enquiry for useful dairy cows; plenty of buyers for the right stamp and good selling trade. Useful and promising cows looked for. Trade was well maintained throughout the day, with a good wind up and clearance.
