The German communiqué says that in the Donetz area, east of Kharkov, nine Russian tanks were destroyed. On other sectors fresh attacks in recurring frost were frustrated with heavy losses to the enemy. Artillery shelled important military targets in Leningrad and Kronstadt with good effect. The Finnish air force destroyed several columns on the Karelian isthmus on March 28th and shot down 27 Soviet planes.

Harrassing activity by the British is reported from Libya.

Mr. Drakeford, Australian Commonwealth Minister, announces that in New Guinea fighting, probably over ten per cent. of the cruiser strength of the Japanese navy was destroyed.

WAS IN THE OLD I.R.A.

Mr. Thomas McNamara, a native of Loughill, Co. Limerick, died recently in New York. A member of the West Limerick Brigade of the Old I.R.A., he was arrested in 1916. He is survived by his widow, Teresa (nee Gilmartin), of Clare, and by four children.
