THE MUNSTER FAIR

The Munster fair at Limerick this morning was on the small side, but trade was unusually good and a general clearance was effected at an early hour. Two-year-old heifers were in great demand, and in this department prices soared by about 2 per head, as compared with a month ago. One vendor told a "Limerick Leader" representative that at the last Munster fair he could not dispose of a lot of two-year-old heifers at £20 each. To-day he disposed of them at £22 each—and without any bother. Beef, too, was in demand and all on offer was sold at prices ranging from 47/6 per cwt. to 59/6 on foot. One lot of fat bullocks were sold at £39 each. Average prices—fat heifers and bullocks—£30 to £39; two-year-olds, £22 to £25 10s.; fat cows, £24 15s. to £29 10s.; two-year-old heifers and bullocks, £18 to £21 10s.; yearlings, £10 to £11 10s.
