### WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, June 10th:—Cattle—Numbers on sale showed a substantial increase on last week, being the heaviest entry of the season; improved description. Home buyers and exporters in strong attendance. Beef a good supply, in active demand; rates well up to current values. Young fresh cows are finding favour and were easily cashed; oldish and thin sorts not so active; nicely done fat cattle sold readily and wanted; well bred useful stores with condition found ready purchasers; some useful drafts of feeders in store section; the right stamp beat recent quotations; top rates well maintained; firm enquiry for two year old bullocks and heifers, particularly for choice flowery heifers, which were keenly bid for, value barometer indicating a rise. The yearlings on sale included some really nice drafts, and the demand for well bred yearlings was ready and firm. Proceedings were marked with a business-like disposition and followed a steady and firm routine. All round improved trade; the day wound up with a strong finish and good clearance. Fat heifers and bullocks, best, £25 15s. to £30; second run, £21 15s. to £24 15s.; fat cows, best, £24 10s. to £29 10s.; second run, £18 to £22 15s.; old, £13 10s. to £16 15s.; two year old heifers and bullocks, best, £16 to £21 10s.; second run, £12 to £14 10s.; yearlings, best, £10 5s. to £14; second run, £7 to £10.

**Sheep**—Average supply; the turnout a fairly useful character. Well fed sheep freely bid for; last week's rates maintained; full prices paid for finished sheep. Hoggets not as good a class as last week and did not touch top rates; suitable hoggets steady enquiry. Ewes met a slow trade. Store sheep, demand quiet. Market well cleared. Early lamb sale was held to-day; average entry. Well done lambs fit for the trade met a free sale at top rates.
