MRS. BRIDGET O'MAHONY.

The sad news of the death of Mrs. Bridget O'Mahony, which took place at her residence, 29 Bishop Street, Limerick, on 6th inst., evoked feelings of widespread sorrow and deep regret in the city generally, but especially in St. Mary's Parish, where she was extremely popular.

Deceased was wife of Mr. James O'Mahony, who represented the Arch-Confraternity of the Holy Family in the Eternal City in 1924, where he was given a special audience by our late Holy Father, Pope Pius XI. She was the mother also of Rev. Father Cyril, O.F.M., the well-known preacher and lecturer.

A good wife and a loving mother, she was the personification of gentleness, and was never known to offend. Her long and patient suffering she bore with true Christian fortitude, and when the end came she passed to her eternal reward fortified by the last Rites of the Holy Church.

The funeral cortege to Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery was of immense proportions, and testified to the esteem in which the deceased was held.

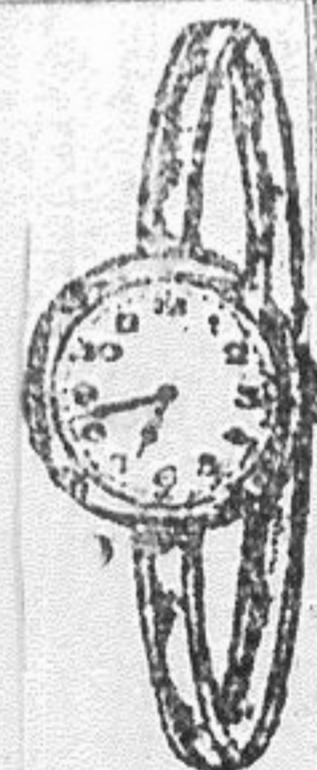

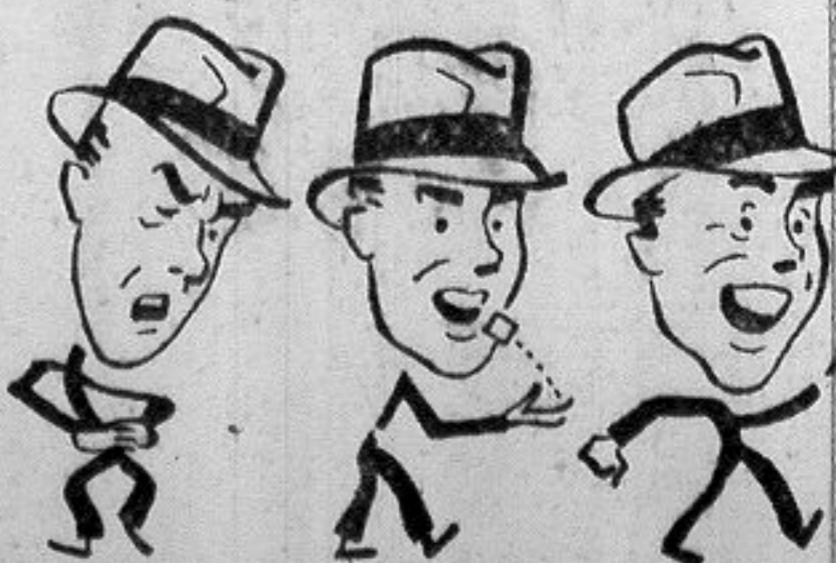
