WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, June 17th:—The muster of cattle showed a substantial increase on last Wednesday, and constituted a record for this season; a much better class; more fat and strong cattle, with many drafts of nice quality stores, which changed hands readily. Value barometer on the higher level. Strong and representative attendance of buyers; home and shipping interests represented. Beef met a firm selling trade at full current rates, especially nice quality medium weighted heifers, which were in strong demand. Full entry of cows; fresh young beef cows steadily placed; firm demand and ready exchange; this class met brisk trade at advanced rates; all cleared. Enquiry for strong cattle, forward lots and promising feeders; this class also met brisk trade at full current rates. In young stores business was exceptionally brisk; quality and condition commanded ready buyers; active enquiry and sharp competition for top lots; previous full terms freely paid; no difficulty in cashing the right class; for small cattle and plainer types demand was not as buoyant. The yearlings on sale included some really nice drafts; the demand for well bred yearlings was ready and firm; prices well up to previous level; backward and plainer sorts hard to negotiate. Proceedings wound up with a strong and satisfactory finish, with a substantial volume of business transacted. Market well cleared. Fat heifers and bullocks, best, £28 to £32 10s.; second run, £19 to £27 5s.; fat cows, best, £25 15s. to £29 second run, £19 to £25; others, £13 to £18; two year old heifers and bullocks, best, £19 10s. to £25 5s.; second run, £13 to £18 5s.; yearlings, best, £10 to £12; second run, £8 to £9 11s.
