REMANDED FOR SEVEN DAYS

At Ennis District Court, before Justice D. F. Gleeson, Michael Broderick, of Scalp, East Clare, was charged with making a signed statement to Sergeant O'Reilly, of Feakle, that about half an hour after daybreak on the 12th June his father's dwelling house had been forcibly entered by two masked and armed men, who carried away carpenter's tools, which statement, it was alleged by the prosecution, was false.

On the application of Supt. Murray the accused was remanded for one week.

KILLED BY STONE FROM WALL

When a little boy aged 7, named John Ahern, Sarsfield Street, Kilmallock, was playing at the back of his home he attempted to climb a rather high wall. A stone from the top of the wall fell on his head, inflicting serious injuries. He was admitted to Croom Co. Hospital, where he later died from laceration of the brain. At an inquest held by Dr. J. P. Cleary, Coroner for East Limerick, a verdict of accidental death was returned.
