LOUIS DE COURCY'S LAND AND PROPERTY SALES.

On Tuesday last Mr. Louis de Courcy, Auctioneer, offered for sale by auction on the lands at Sixmilebridge, by instructions of the owners, the accommodation holding situated at Cappagh Lodge, Sixmilebridge, Co. Clare, the area being 5 acres, 2 roods and 27 perches. These lands are held from the Irish Land Commission, subject to the revised annuity of £3 1s.; P.L.V., £5 10s. Bidding for this holding opened at £100 and advanced rapidly to £300, at which price and auction fees Mr. Joseph M. Collins, solicitor, Limerick, was declared the purchaser, in trust. The price was considered highly satisfactory and exceeded expectations, working out at almost £120 per Irish acre. Messrs. Kerin, Hickman and O'Donnell, solicitors, Bindon St., Ennis, Co. Clare, had carriage of sale. A 4-column hay shed was then sold for £70 and commission.

The single storey residence with forge adjoining at Carrowkeel, Lisnagry, Co. Limerick, held free of rent (P.L.V., £1 5s.), which was recently offered for sale by auction with the consent of all parties concerned and withdrawn at £85, has since been sold by private treaty to Mr. Michael Lawlor, Killenagarraff, Lisnagry, for £100 and fees. Mr. Joseph M. Collins, solicitor, Glentworth St., Limerick, had carriage of sale.

Mr. de Courcy has also sold by private treaty for Miss C. A. Fitzgibbon her holding at Dromlara, Pallasgrean, Co. Limerick, which contains 5 acres and 1 rood, subject to the Land Commission annuity of £1 9s. (P.L.V., £7 15s.) with two-storey residence and out-offices. Mr. T. O'B.
