DEATH OF MR. E. J. SHEEHY.

We regret to announce the death of Mr. Edward John Sheehy, of Cherrygrove, Croom, which occurred on Sunday, 23rd inst., at the residence of his sister, Mrs. Bryan Sheehy, 57 O'Connell St., Limerick. Eldest son of Major Bryan Sheehy, of Cherrygrove, Croom, and Newcastle West, Mr. Sheehy was a member of one of the oldest Catholic families in the county. He was an extensive landowner and in his earlier days held a Commission in the Limerick Militia. He was educated at Clongowes Wood College, and throughout his life he had occupied a high and respected position in the county. The funeral took place from Banogue Church, after Requiem High Mass, yesterday to the family burial ground at Monegay. The chief mourners were—Mrs. Bryan Sheehy (widow of the late Mr. Brian E. F. Sheehy, B.E.) and Miss Jane Sheehy (sisters); Miss Sadie Sheehy and Miss Pat Sheehy (nieces); Thomas Fitzgerald Sheehy and Edward Fitzgerald Sheehy, of Moviddy, Newcastle West; Robert Keatinge Sheehy and Peter Keatinge Sheehy, of Fortwilliam, Dromcollogher; and Roger O'Sullivan, solr., Limerick (cousins).
