He bored three small holes in the partition between the dressing room and the Secretary's office, and spent days watching for the unknown thief. On one occasion a golfer arrived in the dressing room and hung his coat over the observation hole, and the detective had to patiently remain in the Secretary's office awaiting the removal of the coat, which happened after an hour and a half. His days of vigil were rewarded by catching the thief red-handed. A suspensory sentence of three months imprisonment was imposed.
