DEATH OF MR. WALTER BRAZIER

The death of Mr. Walter Brazier, which took place yesterday at his residence, Lord Edward St., Limerick, removes a very popular and highly esteemed citizen. For upwards of forty years, until his honourable retirement the deceased was a highly placed official on the staff of the Limerick County Council. He had an intimate knowledge of the intricate laws relating to Local Government, and in that connection it might be observed that his association with the public was always of the most cordial character. His genial and affable disposition made him a universal favourite, and the news of his death will occasion profound regret and sorrow. In early life he was an accomplished actor, his histrionic talents being of a very high order. He was a member of the original Limerick Operatic Society, which specialised in Gilbert and Sullivan productions, and the deceased, for many seasons, was "leader" in baritone parts. His fine, flexible, resonant voice fitted him to fill many exacting roles, but he secured his greatest successes in "The Gondoliers" and "Iolanthe." Death has removed a grand old citizen, and the sympathy of the citizens will go out unstintedly to the family in their bereavement.

The remains were removed last evening to St. Michael's Church, the cortege being of very large proportions. The interment will take place to-morrow (Thursday) to Mount St. Lawrence at 3 p.m.
