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## THE HAMMER TOO LIGHT.

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The Amateur Athletic Union of Ireland have decided that the hammer throw of Bert Healion at a recent sports meeting in Dublin should not be passed as a record, as the hammer only weighed 15lb. 14oz. and 10 drams, instead of 16lb. Healion, a 25 years old County Wick man, was returned as throwing the 16lbs. hammer 192 feet 6½ inches, which was better than that of Pat Ryan's record in New York in 1913, when he threw 189 feet 6½ inches.

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## NORTHERN MILK SUPPLIES

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Northern Ireland farmers are being asked to increase winter milk production to avoid milk rationing in the Six-Counties and to help to off-set a shortage in the main. Liquid milk sales in Northern Ireland have risen from 100,000 gallons a year (pre-war) to 2,000,000 gallons.

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## NEW LICENSING BILL

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The new Licensing Bill, which is the Dail agenda for a second reading on October 14th, will, it is expected, be issued within a fortnight. None of its provisions have yet been made known.
