October 21st—Cattle—The entry in the market exceeded last Wednesday's, and in point of numbers, all accommodation filled to capacity, and in quality and description well maintained. The stores included many calves, with more beef and strong yearlings. A big attendance. Business brisk for the lots of beef, which got cleared at full terms. Light weight calves, secondary and older sorts in favour. In the store cattle, the active and strong, with a firm tone for promising feeders. Prices well maintained, and for probably bred drafts somewhat dearer, and change. Forward 2½ year old ready buyers. In young stores, and top rates touched for calves. One and a half year old heifers with condition meeting trade throughout the day; and plain types changed hands at good rates; all useful lots being freely bid for best drafts a turn in vendors. Calves showing colour easily found customers at satisfactory prices. The general tone of the market marked with a business-like position at full values. Over the week, as marked with much energy and considerably greater volume of business than last week, and a brisk and clearance.
