YOU KNOW that the Private Soldier serving in the Army has just got an increase in pay? Instead of 14/- per week the recruit commences with 17/6 per week.

YOU KNOW that in addition to the increased pay, a sum of money is also put aside and saved up for every serving soldier? That means that at the end of the present Emergency, that sum calculated from the beginning of October or from the date of enlistment, if later, and amounting to over £9 per year will be paid out to every N.C.O. and Man.

YOU KNOW that as well as the ordinary daily rate of pay, additional pay varying from 3d. to 5/- per day is granted to Soldiers who qualify at various trades and other occupations? Fitters and Turners, Motor Drivers and Mechanics, Electricians, Plumbers, Welders and other Tradesmen are urgently required.

YOU KNOW that the Private Soldier gets 14 days annual leave with full pay and ration allowance, and a free travelling warrant to and from his home?

YOU KNOW that the trained Soldier who worked on a farm before he joined the Army for the duration of the Emergency may obtain special Agricultural Leave for two separate periods in the year of one month each for sowing and harvesting, and with a free travelling warrant to and from his home?

YOU KNOW that you will have an opportunity to join the Army when the Recruiting Bus comes to your home town next week? Bring your Ration Book with you. The Army provides free food and plenty of it, free clothing, accommodation and medical attention.

LIMERICK AND ITS HISTORY Established Facts And Bogus "Traditions"

Limerick and its History formed the subject of a very interesting and instructive lecture given in the Municipal Hall on Sunday night last by Rev. Michael Moloney, P.P., St. Patrick's. The lecture was organized by the Limerick Local Society and the aid of the Penny Dinners Fund and Mr. J. O'Kelly Lynch, Mayor of the O'Connell Street Branch of the Municipal Council.

AN IRISH SETTLEMENT. In the open country south of the river, an Irish settlement grew up beyond Banta's Bridge (Drogheda) and Limerick. The settlement was founded by the bishop's manors of Mungret and Kilbuckley in the thirteenth century.
