## THE PADDOCKS, LIMERICK.

### Weekly Cattle and Sheep Market and Annual Xmas Fat Stock Sale.

Wednesday, December 16th—The entry in both cattle and sheep was a record, numbering 1,160 head. There was a big attendance and full muster of buyers, including many from a distance. In the beef section an extra good supply of heifers and bullocks of a most useful class. Suitable fat cattle readily placed at top rates; heifers preferential demand; one extra prime heifer realising the high figure of £38. A heavy entry of young fresh well bred beef cows, which were freely bid for and cashed, rates favouring vendors. Strong bullocks in brisk demand. In aged cattle with condition trade moved in a firm groove, with a ready repetition of last week's rates. Fine forward stores came in for attention. In young stores a useful description, which were in good demand at recent rates. Calves showing colour and quality found customers. Good demand and brisk bidding for all classes to close of day; all-round trade was buoyant. Fat heifers and bullocks, best, £28 10s. to £38; second run, £20 10s. to £27 10s.; fat cows, £24 10s. to £28 15s.; second run, £18 to £23 10s.; old, £13 15s. to £17; 2½ year old bullocks and heifers, £17 15s. to £23; 1½ year old heifers, £15 14s. to £18 2s. 6d.; second run, £11 5s. to £15 2s.; 1½ year old bullocks, £13 15s. to £16 7s. 6d.; second run, £10 1s. to £13 10s.

**Sheep**—An extra heavy supply, all available accommodation being filled; a good turnout of mutton. Buyers showed a favourable business disposition for choice pens, and were quite willing to part full values; firm tone ruled with a ready repetition of last week's top rates.
