The death took place recently at New York of Patrick McCarthy, Dryden Chief Inspector, New York Police Department, and a native of Kilmore, Co. Limerick. He was responsible for the new way traffic systems to remove congestion; he was appointed to the police in 1886 by the late Theodore Roosevelt, then Police Commissioner. On his retirement he was head of all traffic organization in the city; he was responsible for establishing many bridges and roads of safety.
