and was principal of the firm of Mesors J H Nash & Sons Estate Agen's Limerick He was High Sheriff of Limerick in 1908, when he was Knighted by King Edward VII and in 1909 was created a Knight Commander of the Order of St Gregory by

Pope Pige X He took a keen interest in his native city and had been a Deputy Lieutenant, a County Grand Juror and a Justice of the Sir Vincent received his early education

at the Crescent College, Limerick. He got his Degrees of Medicine at Dublic University, but never practiced. He was associated actively with every charitable movement in Limerick. He was Governor of St John's Hospital, Limerick, and was with the late Most Rev Dr O'Dwyer, a founder of the St Vincent De Paul Naming Association, of which he was Hon, Trees,
