

Link With Fight For Freedom

The death took place recently at Sheares street, Kilmallock, of Miss Christine Walsh, who was a member of a family that suffered much during the troubled period and one member of which had earned for himself a distinguished place in the independence movement and whose name must be written largely in the annals of that heroic struggle. Miss Walsh was a woman whose selflessness for the cause was shared to the full by her sister, for she had the same aspirations and the same hopes, and was not lacking in the same qualities of fearlessness and sincerity that were so notable in her fighting brother. The remains were removed to St. Peter and Paul's Church, Kilmallock, and the funeral, which was of impressive dimensions took place in the family burial ground at Tashardowna. The officiating priests at the graveside were Very Rev. Dean Maloney, P.P., V.P., assisted by Rev. Fr. Condon, O.C., and Rev. Fr. Moriarty, O.C.
