

The Late Ald. Joseph McInerney.

The funeral of Alderman J McInerney, whose deeply regretted demise took place at St. John's Hospital on Saturday last, in Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery, as was to be expected, was a very striking demonstration of public sympathy and respect to the memory of a man who during his long and honourable life had rendered untiring and self-sacrificing service to the service of his fellow-men; and for the best part of his life, particularly in the poor and needy. The cortège was headed by his Worship the Mayor (Mr D J O'Malley, esq), and included all the City Deputies, members of the Corporation, the Harbour Board and other public bodies, with their officials. A guard of honour was provided by the members of the City Fire Brigade, and conspicuous in the procession were many members of the L.S.F., of which the deceased was an active member.
