

# A Distinguished Citizen

## Death of Mr. James McGuire.

With feelings of the very deepest regret we record the passing of Mr James McGuire, Managing Director of the well-known and old-established Unraghower Mills, Crown Mills Bakery, and Messrs J. R. Tinsley, & Co., etc, importers, which took place at St. John's Hospital on Tuesday morning.

Deceased gentleman was a member of a name honored Limerick family, being the second son of the late Mr Martin McGuire. For many years he was connected with and took a very active part in the commercial life of his native city, and in fact in everything pertaining to the welfare of Limerick. As a member of the Limerick Harbour Board up to some years ago, when he retired, and the Limerick Chamber of Commerce, he will be remembered for his devoted interest.

A very kind, gentle and unassuming personality—qualities which won for him the esteem and affection of his fellow-citizens to a marked degree—the late Mr McGuire was indeed a very great gentleman. He was a kind and considerate employer, and as a benefactor to the necessitous poor his name will be for long revered by many of our less fortunate citizens.

The remains were removed to St. Michael's Church on Wednesday evening, followed by an extremely large cortege of sympathizers. Requiem Mass for the soul of deceased was celebrated at noon on Thursday, and the funeral took place subsequently to St. Lawrence Cemetery. Here again was striking evidence of the public sympathy felt at the passing of an old citizen and a remarkable token of respect to the members of his family. The professional and commercial life of the city were fully represented. In fact it can verily be said that all classes and creeds from the city and its confines marched in this huge procession.
