Limerick Nun's Death A sad tragedy courred near Belvoir,

S zmilebridge, on Toesday evening, when Sister Mary Clare O'Dopovao, a member of the Mercy Order at Wanstead House, London, was killed when a pony attached

to a trap in which she was driving boiled. Accompanied by her father, Mr John O'Donovan, of Marroe, county Limerick, the deceased was visiting her uncle, Mr

yards from the residence the pony suddenly shied and awerved to the right hand side of be road. The wheel of the car mounted the fence and the trap turned over. that the deceased agn had only recently retorned from England to spend a holiday at home and to be present at the ordinarion of her brother, Rev Matthew O'Donovad, at Charles last Sanday week. Immediately following the secident Dr O Foyne, Kilkishen, was called on the scene but life was

estinet. THE INQUEST. At an inquest held at Bramilebridge a verdict was returned in accordance with the medical testimony. Evidence was given to show that the decessed died from fracture
