Vol. Walsh gave componentive evidence. Cant R. Russ. April Medical. Capt R Ryan, Army Medical Corps, said death was due to amphyx a following im-mersion in the water.

The jury returned a verdict in accordance with the medical testimony, and sympathy was ortended to the relatives of the deceased.

The foremen of the jury (Mr P Stundon) exid Vol. Doyle deducate wask in trying to rescue his friend. Both men were to be bly commended.

The coroner concurred and said that he considered the bravery of Doyle deserved special recognition from his authorities.
