

Death of Mr. Walter Brazier.

It is with very sincere regret that we announce the death of Mr Walter Brazier, which occurred at his residence, Lord Edward street, Limerick, this morning. Deceased was not in the best of health for some time. Born in Henry street over 70 years ago, deceased, who was a most popular citizen, was for a long number of years—practically since the passing of the Local Government Act of 1898—a member of the clerical staff of the Limerick Co. Council, retiring on well merited pension a few years ago. The late Mr Brazier was indeed a lovable personality, ever good-humoured, sympathetic, kindly and charitable, and his friends were legion. Keenly interested in music and the opera, he was a valued member of the old Limerick Operatic Society, and figured in many of that Society's productions on the stage of the old Theatre Royal. He was a good father, a sincere and loyal friend, ever ready with a helping hand and a kind word for his less fortunate fellow-citizens. A most interesting and pleasant companion, the sympathy of the citizens will go out to his highly respected family unmeasured in their irreparable loss.

The remains will be removed from his late residence this (Tuesday) evening at 8 p.m. to St. Michael's Church, from whence the funeral will take place to-morrow (Wednesday) at 3 p.m.
