
Limerickman's Death In London

The death is announced, at his Clapham home, of Mr John P Kelly, O.S.M. for some years until his retirement in 1885 Deputy Chief Inspector of H.M. Board of Customs and Excise, and a native of Feohanagh, co. Limerick. He was brother of Mr James Kelly, Feohanagh, and Mr Joseph Kelly, Springmount, Abbeyfeale, and is survived by his widow [formerly a Miss Lynch, of Pallaskeyry], and by a son and daughter. The late Mr Kelly, who was 72, was the eldest of a family of ten, all boys. He entered the customs service in 1861 and passed through all the grades. He was a nephew of Rev Mother Emmanuel, of the Richmond Hill Convent, Leeds, and brother of the late Fr Michael Kelly, O.S.B., a well known member of the Holy Ghost Order.
