

Limerick Canon's Death

By the death of Very Rev John Canon Fitzgerald, P.P., Kilcoleman and Conleappa, the Diocese of Limerick has lost one of its oldest and most revered priests. The rev. gentleman, who was in his 80th year, passed away in St John's Hospital on Saturday. He had been in poor health for some time past, and his death was not unexpected. Throughout his ministry he served in the Diocese, and was Parish Priest of Macister prior to his transfer to Kilcoleman fourteen years ago. He was a native of Ballysimon, Limerick, and was educated at Maynooth, as was also Very Rev William Cusack Fitzgerald, who died some years ago.

He was brother of the late Very Rev W Cusack Fitzgerald, P.P., V.R., Shanagolden, and son of Mr D Fitzgerald, solicitor, Limerick; Dr M Fitzgerald and Dr J Fitzgerald, Middlesboro.

There were a large number of priests at his funeral which took place at Kilcoleman. The celebrant of the Solemn Requiem Mass was Rev J Kelly, C.C., Ballingarry (cousin); deacon, Rev Fr Hanley, C.S.S.R. (cousin); sub-deacon, Rev J Keogh, C.C.; master of ceremonies, H. v J Wilmet, C.C.; chanters, Very Rev P Canon, Thornehill, P.P., Adare, and Rev J O'Byrne, C.C. Right Rev Monsignor Hassett, P.P., V.G., Newcastle West, presided.
